## GROWING INCOME INEQUALITY STINKS

Income inequality today threatens to wreck all we have and all we want to be. It is a bloated and ravenous monster that is pulling us apart. There is no safe way to ignore it or live with it.

Right now the Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) running our top corporations get paid 235 times as much as the rest of us.

235 TIMES! Each of us would have to win a multi-million dollar lottery every year we worked to match their average annual take home pay of \$7.7 MILLION. They earn more in just one year than most of us earn in FOUR WORKING LIFETIMES.

Inequality on this scale was unheard of even in the bad old days of the robber barons. It cannot be endured much longer. The actual damage it does to our economy is too great. The deeper damage it does to our spirit of community, of civil society, of social solidarity, of simple togetherness is seering and soul destroying.

Gross income inequality on this scale is the net result of our acceptance of government policies and actions that require us to: abandon even the pretense of tax fairness; cannibalize and privatize quality public services; severe labour rights from human rights and smash good jobs into smithereens. All this can only harm us as individuals and as a nation.

THE GOOD NEWS is that income inequality is not like bad weather or bad luck. We don't just have to suck it up and carry on. We can do something about it. We can make our governments listen to us and act to make the reduction of income inequality their number one priority.

Since 1982, our governments have passed 204 pieces of legislation that have restricted, suspended or denied collective bargaining rights for Canadian workers.

- It seems like it's free because we don't have to pay any extra fees beyond our taxes to get all of it.
- It is non-profit—nobody makes any money off it.
- It applies to everything—not just to certain illnesses or injuries in certain circumstances.

These same principles apply to all our best public services. They are universal, free of charge, non-profit and all-inclusive. They apply to police, fire and paramedics; to child protection, addiction counselling, and home care; to old age pensions, snow plowing and early childhood education; to food inspection, highways maintenance, and

street cleaning. We don't pay extra for them. We don't really need to think about them. We just expect them to be there. And they are. Along with the hundreds upon hundreds of other public services we depend on to get through all our days safe and sound.

#### **OUR KIND OF FUTURE**

The future of our kind of Canada depends on public services. The more we eliminate or modify them, the more we reduce access to them or even limit access to them to those who can pay, the more we drift away from the kind of Canada we have built together.

If we turn public services into a private, forprofit, cash-and-carry enterprise more and more of us are going to be left out or left behind. This is not how we can stay true to ourselves. This has no place in our story.

Our story is the story of a country filled with people who want to improve everybody's chance of getting a fair shot at a good life. We've been doing that with public services. That's why public services were, are and will always be the story of our life.



#### TAX FAIRNESS SEALS THE DEAL

The deal that we all agree to. The deal that makes it possible for us all to live together.

The deal that says each and every one of us is ready to pay his or her fair share of taxes to keep Canada going the way we want.

## TAX FAIRNESS SEALS


